In the beginning, they met in the home of the James' followed by a series of meetings in the home of Dr. Gene and Reina Fontenot. As a symbol of honesty and truthfulness, they chose to name the club Cherry Tree Republicans. Soon afterward, Newt Gingrich issued his "Contract with America" and conservatives became determined to work together to claim a Republican majority in both houses of Congress.
